THE SOLUTION

The next Federal Government needs to:

- Return the Commonwealth's share of legal aid commission funding to 50 per cent with the States and Territories. This would amount to an additional \$126m in the 2016 Commonwealth Budget.
- 2. Immediately provide a further \$120 million to cover civil legal assistance, with the States and Territories contributing \$80 million, comprising a total of \$200 million, as recommended by the Productivity Commission.
- 3. Immediately reverse further Commonwealth funding cuts to legal assistance services announced in 2014, due to take effect from July 2017. These include:
 - a. \$12.1 million in cuts to community legal centres
 - b. \$4 million on cuts to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Legal Services; and
 - c. all cuts directed at policy and advocacy work conducted by legal assistance bodies, as recommended by the <u>Productivity Commission</u>.

In total, we are calling for an additional \$350 million to end the crisis in legal aid.
